FINES OPTION PROGRAM

Have you recently received a ticket and your funds are a little tight, or simply do not want to pay? Did you know the Town of Lemberg participates in the Fine Option Program?

The Fine Option Program is not an alternative to sentencing but allows people to settle fines by doing unpaid, supervised community service work rather than paying in cash. The Ministry of Justice works with town councils, First Nations communities, local non-profit organizations or an individual to administer the Fine Option Program in the community under a contractual agreement. These organizations or individuals, called fine option agencies, assign suitable community service work to people who register to settle fines under the program. The agencies also advise the court of the outcome of the assignment. To be eligible you must obtain an order from court to register for the program.

ADOPT OR SPONSPOR A PLANTER

This year the Town would like to allow residents to show off their green thumb! Participants are responsible for planting the flowers and maintaining the planter for the summer.
