# MONTHLY RESIDENT METER READINGS - CLARIFICATION

As announced last month, we have moved to monthly, resident reported meter readings. For consumption accuracy, take your readings at the same time every month according to the dates noted on the cards. The preferred method for reporting is a photo of the meter *with* the monthly meter card as in the sample shown. Your photo should be emailed to <u>lemberg@sasktel.net</u>. For those who cannot submit a photo, return your meter card to the Town Office. Public Works will

perform on-site meter reads twice annually only at residences without photos. Thank you to those who have given positive feedback on this initiative confirming we're on the right track.

#### Transfer Station User/Load Fees

Garbage Bag - \$2.00/bag

Trailer

- \$10.00/load

- $\frac{1}{2}$  or 1 ton truck level load
  - \$25.00/load
- 3 ton truck level load

- \$100.00/load

Furniture (mattresses, couches, chairs, tables, etc.)

- \$20.00/each
- **Appliances** (must be free of freon and doors removed)
  - \$20.00/each

## Construction/demo waste

- \$50.00/load level load/1 ton
- \$200.00/load dump trailer
- \$300.00/load 3 ton
- After Posted Hours Landfill Access
  - \$90.00/occurrence

Fees are at the discretion of the Landfill Attendant. Please ensure you have the correct change with you as staff does not have change.

## Items Not Accepted at Transfer Station

- automobiles and automobile parts
- pesticides and other hazardous wastes or an material or thing treated with any of those substances, including the receptacles containing them
- petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products
- refuse that is the remains or byproduct of slaughter house operations (dead animals or parts of dead animals)
- liquid domestic sewage
- batteries
- tires
- grease
- oil
- liquid waste
- asbestos material
- flammable substances
- electronics
- propane tanks
- paint
- hazardous waste or substances
