THIS MONTH, OUR FOCUS is the Lemberg and District Cemetery.

The Cemetery Committee met on January 11, 2022 to plan this year's projects of enhancement to our local cemetery. A cleaning/work bee is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, April 21 and 22, weather permitting. During this time, we will cover the grounds to do general cleaning, filling of any gopher holes and trimming if required. We also plan to haul dirt, level and seed grass on graves that need attention and continue removal of covers. It has been identified that parts of the new section are mostly clay and need topsoil and seed.

In 2019 we began to remove damaged and unsightly grave covers and surrounds. The project ground to a halt when a few families made their objections to these changes known. The committee has decided to move forward with removal unless we are notified to leave as is. **If you are opposed to removal of covers or surrounds on your loved one's grave, we ask you to contact us by email at lemberg@sasktel.net before the work bee.** Please note "Cemetery" as the email subject.

Over the past year, much time has been spent identifying graves that don't have headstones and the committee has made it a priority to have these graves marked as soon as possible. It was estimated there are approximately 70 unmarked graves. During our meeting we contacted a local monument representative to discuss options for a simple yet lasting piece. His recommendation was a 1 foot by 8 inch flat granite stone to be mounted on a cement pad sized to provide a 3 inch border. His estimate was around \$200 per marker plus \$5000 for installation. Since the meeting, final count is 87 which means we are looking at a total cost of approximately \$22,400 or \$260 per grave. Not surprising, there isn't that much money in the cemetery account so we are looking for donations and/or grave sponsors. An alphabetical list follows. If you recognize any of these names as being your

family member, please consider sponsoring their monument. You may also choose to sponsor a monument or make a donation. All contributions are considered charitable contributions and you will be provided a receipt for income tax purposes. Any and all donations are most gratefully accepted.

The Town Office is in the process of updating our records to include contact information for relatives of anyone that has been laid to rest in our cemetery. Again, this information can be emailed to lemberg@sasktel.net with "cemetery" as the subject, or mailed to our address at the bottom of the next page.
