At the July 18, 2022 regular meeting of council, policy 700-7 was passed, which states the following:

It is the responsibility of the property owner for the upkeep of the boulevards, to maintain the current state whether it is grass, dirt, or gravel/rock.

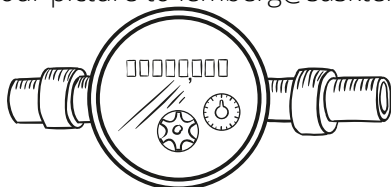
- a. If there is grass, ensure it is mowed.
- b. If there is dirt or gravel/rock, ensure that it is weed free.
- c. Ensure debris is not put on the streets.

PUBLIC HEARING AUGUST 23, 2022

On July 18, 2022 Council passed the 1st reading of Bylaw 2022-06 Official Community Plan and Bylaw 2022-07 Zoning Bylaw. On August 23, 2022 Council will hear those that wish to speak to the document.

The meeting procedures set by Bylaw 2020-18 Council Procedure allows each person wishing to present a maximum of ten (10) minutes, and written submissions will be discussed. All written and verbal representations will form a part of the minutes.

Per the public notice published in the LeaderPost on July 22 and July 29, written submissions can be submitted to the office before the meeting. Any person or group that wants to comment may do so on August 23, 2022 in Council Chambers.
