WATER READINGS AND CONSUMPTION

It has almost been a year since monthly meter readings were implemented. Have you been surprised at the amount of water you consume?

Below are some estimates for how much water is consumed during daily activities:

- The average 10-minute shower uses 25 gallons of water.
- Filling a tub for a bath is approximately 36 gallons.
- For every minute you run water, whether it be brushing your teeth, cleaning your face, or washing your hands, you use 2.5 gallons.
- A standard top-load washing machine uses 30 - 35 gallons per wash. A high-efficiency washing machine uses 14 gallons per wash.
- Depending on the machine's age, a dishwasher uses 2.5 - 7.5 gallons per load.
- Handwashing dishes also uses 2.5 - 7.5 gallons.
- Toilet flushing, depending on the type and age of the toilet, uses 1.5 - 5 gallons per flush.
- Water softener regeneration uses 35 - 65 gallons.
- RO systems use 4 - 25 gallons for every gallon produced.
- Watering your lawn for 1 hour using a standard garden hose uses about 1,020 gallons of water. That's 17 gallons of water per minute. One way to reduce this amount is to use a soaker hose.
