WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPGRADE

The administration has been hard at work ensuring the essential water treatment plant (WTP) upgrade is provided at a reasonable, affordable, and accurate cost. In 2019 Associated Engineering provided the Town with a preliminary quote of \$2.9 million (\$3.5 today) to obtain a new WTP. Upon further research, speaking with numerous firms, and hard work, the Town has secured a more reasonable number of a \$1.8 to \$2 million valuation.

What does this mean? The Town is hopeful of securing an Investing in Canada's Infrastructure Program (ICIP) grant. The grant contribution structure is Federal 40%, Provincial 33.33%, and Local 26.67%. If the upgrade cost the Town \$2 million, contributions are as follows Federal \$800,000, Provincial \$666,600, and Town \$533,400.

What about the water minerals we lose? This has been brought to administration many times and a solution was found, by designing a biological nanofiltration system. Nanomembranes are looser allowing more minerals through, an added benefit being water passing through distribution pipes is not "feeding" off the pipes either.

How does it save you money? Hardware longevity, removal of water softeners thus saving on softener salt, no longer require point-of-use treatment systems, consumables related to those systems, save on the energy required to operate point-of-use systems, wastewater reduction, and reduced potential of monthly consumption overages.
