UTILITY RATE INCREASE

In 2023 utility rates will be increasing. As per bylaw 2022-01 the rates will be as follows:

Water rates: 2,700 or less \$33.00/month

2,701 or more \$7.00/1,000 gallons

Sewer rate: \$42.00 (\$45.00 for cafes)
Infrastructure rate: \$33.00/month
Waste Management rate: \$20.00/month

Minimum monthly charge will be \$128.00/month.

Interest rates for late fees increase to 4%.

Please make sure you have updated your payments with your financial institution to avoid interest charges.

2023 TOWN BUDGET MEETING

Council is meeting on February 7, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. to discuss the current fiscal year's budget. The meeting will be held in Council Chambers at 332 Main Street.

Residents are welcome and encouraged to attend.

SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

As of July 1, 2022 the new Construction Codes Act (CCA) and building regulations require all existing residential buildings to have smoke and Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarms.

- Smoke alarms must be installed on each storey (including the basement) in each sleeping room and hallways within 5 meters of sleeping rooms.
- Smoke alarms must be hard-wired and interconnected
 - The exception: Building constructed before June 6, 1988. Battery operated is allowed but must be sealed with a 10-year battery.
- CO alarms must be installed on each storey.
- CO alarms must be hard-wired and interconnected.
 - The exception: Buildings constructed before October 1, 2009. Battery operated is allowed, but must be a sealed unit with a 10-year battery.

PRE-ATHORIZED PAYMENTS

The Town offers pre-authorized payments that take the guesswork of "did I pay my bill" off your plate! Stop by the Town Office today with a void cheque (or account information from your financial institution), and we will start the process!

FEEDING WILDLIFE AND STRAYS

With changing seasons comes wildlife and strays migrating to their new homes. While it can be tempting to feed these animals, we encourage residents not to. For wildlife to get within Town limits, they will need to cross a highway which puts the animals and motorists at risk. Feeding strays encourage these animals to continue to return, causing nuisances or damage to residents properties.
